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


## INTRODUCTION

This work is a lexicon of the 392 words which occur in the fifty-two collects of the Sunday Masses. The words of this vocabulary are listed in groups according to the frequency with which they occur. Each group is then listed alphabetically. A reference to the collect where it may be found is given for each word which occurs only once. The number given after the meaning of those words which occur more than six times indicates the exact number of times that the words may be found in the collects. It must be noted that the words which occur in the ending of the collects "per Dominum nostrum Jesum etc." are not included in this lexicon.
