ARCHBISHOP



Archbishop Paul C. Schulte was born in Fredericktown, Missouri, on March 18, 1890. After attending Kenrick Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, he was ordained on June 11, 1915. After serving as Bishop of Leavenworth, Kansas from 1927 to 1946, he was appointed Archbishop of Indianapolis on July 20, 1946.

In the 21 years that he has been Archbishop, His Excellency has been a model to those seeking the goal of the Priesthood. In acknowledgement for all he has done for us, we humbly ask God's blessing on Archbishop Schulte.






The Blessing of Archabbot Gabriel by Archbishop Schulte.

ARCHABBOT



Father Archabbot Gabriel Verkamp, a native of Ferdinand, Indiana, attended Huntingburg High School before coming to St. Meinrad Minor Seminary. In 1922, he became a Benedictine novice, pronounced his first vows in 1923, and professed his solemn vows in 1926.

During his theological studies at the Pontifical International College at Sant' Anselmo, he was ordained at Monte Cassino, Italy, on July 2, 1929.

For three years before his election as Abbot, he served as Prior of St. Meinrad Archabbey. Before he was Prior, Archabbot Gabriel taught philosophy and sacred theology at St. Meinrad.

Archabbot Gabriel has been pastor at New Boston, Indiana, St. Meinrad, Indiana, and St. Benedict's Parish in Evansville, Indiana.

May God bless Archabbot Gabriel and help him lead the monastery through these troubled times.

Father Kevin was born in Evansville, Indiana, on April 9, 1916. He came to St. Meinrad in 1930 and commenced his studies for the Priesthood. In 1937 he entered the monastic life and was solemnly professed into the Order in 1940. Father Kevin was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on May 21, 1942.

Shortly after receiving the sacrament of Holy Orders, Father Kevin was appointed Physics teacher of the Minor Seminary. In 1950, he was appointed to the position of assistant instructor of the Brothers.

Since 1958, he has been affiliated with the High School. He has enlightened students with his Physics and Algebra classes. As Vice-Rector and Disciplinarian

he encouraged good behavior, and made sure that we followed his encouragements.

Father Kevin was appointed Rector in 1965. Since the High School is closing after this year, the number of students has been diminishing. Because of this, he is often reminding us to do things as a school, not as small groups. He emphasizes that we must get along with everyone. We should thank him for his efforts.

This year, Father Kevin is celebrating his twenty-fifth anniversary to the Holy Priesthood. We, the students of the High School, wish to congratulate him and ask God's blessing to descend upon him and make the next twenty-five years as rewarding as the past twenty-five.

In addition to these other jobs, Father Meinrad also serves on the High School faculty, teaching the World History and American History classes.




Yes, November means Thanksgiving.
